"Marree Man" (the world's largest work of art and one of Australia's greatest "whodone-it" mysteries in recent times) and Lake Eyre South. We then head into the Flinders/Gammon Ranges for 2 nights at Arkaroola. Largely unknown, Arkaroola is one of Australia's true tourism gems.

Day 1 (D): Heading Off

Sunday 6 October

Welcome to our extended **South Australian Tour** featuring the Clare Valley, Leigh Creek (with Outback sightseeing flights over Lake Eyre South) and the **Flinders/Gammon Ranges** in the Far North. Once the coach is loaded and everyone is on board we set off, travelling south to Sydney and then onto **Goulburn** for our first night on tour.

Day 2 (BLD) Across the Hay Plain


We have another travel day ahead of us as we make our way to **Wagga Wagga** and then through to **Narrandera** on the Murrumbidgee River. We have arranged lunch here before we push through to **Hay**. The township is located on the eastern side of the Hay Plain and, like Narrandera, it is situated on the

picturesque Murrumbidgee River. Hay's history is rich with characters and tales of boom and bust - of isolation and innovation. This afternoon we make a brief stop at **Shear Outback**, an innovative and exciting interpretative centre devoted to Shearers - those colourful characters of the bush. We then cross the Hay plain to Balranald and onto **Euston** for our overnight stop.

Day 3 (BLD): Into the Clare Valley

Tuesday 8 October



Take a short walk for a close-up view of the mighty Murray River – our motel is just meters from the riverbank!! We push onto *Mildura* this morning for morning tea at *Orange World* before heading southwest along the Sturt Highway and into the South Australian Riverland. We have a fascinating lunch stop today at the *Overland Corner Hotel* – on the Murray River, just to the north of Lake Bonney.

With the arrival of European settlement Overland Corner, located halfway between Adelaide and Mildura, became a major stopover point for drovers taking stock from New South Wales to the Port of Adelaide. From here we travel through Blanchetown and Taree and into the *Clare Valley*



Day 4 (BLD): Bungaree Station

Just north of Clare is *Bungaree Station*. Established in 1841 it became the headquarters of an extensive sheep station with 100 thousand merino sheep by the 1880s. Today, over 175 years later, it is an efficient mixed farm run by the descendants of the original founder, G.C. Hawker. Consequently, Bungaree Station is not a museum, but rather a living record of rural Australia since 1841. One of the

owners will take us on a most interesting tour of the buildings with family insights into the farm's history. Country hospitality is at the forefront of our visit as we are treated to morning tea and lunch of lamb and rosemary pie followed by a sweet treat with tea and coffee. This afternoon we visit *Martindale Hall*. Step back in time to the days of gracious living on a



large pastoral estate late in the 1800's to early 1900's where a rumoured 14 servants (4 of which lived in the hall) were on call 24 hrs a day to look after the needs of two people! Such was the extravagant upper-class lifestyle of the wealthy pastoralist!!

Day 5 (BLD): To Port Augusta

This morning, we travel into the Southern Flinders Ranges and over to the coast via *Horrocks Pass*. Our lunch stop is at *Port Augusta* at the top of the Spencer Gulf. There is a wonderful outback interpretative centre here called the *Wadlata* which provides a great introduction to visitors to the remote north and northwest of South Australia. We have a look through the Centre and a light lunch before a visit to the *Australian Arid Lands Botanical Gardens*.

Thursday 10 October





It's a stunning story of survival – how the thousands of highly evolved plant communities, have specially adapted to thrive in extreme temperatures and decade lasting droughts. (Meal inclusions: Breakfast & dinner in the Motor Inn/Lunch at Wadlata)

Day 6 (BLD): Port Augusta/Leigh Creek

After continuing through the *Pichi Richi Pass*, we will cross the famed *Goyder's Line* that was marked on the map in 1865 by Surveyor General George Woodroffe Goyder to delineate drought affected country. The line became an important factor in settlement planning in this State, being regarded as an indication of the limits of the lands considered safe for agricultural

development. As we will see from the many ruins on the *Wilochra Plain*, many early settlers didn't take Goyder's advice! An excellent example is *Kanyaka Homestead* just south of Hawker. Next is *Hawker* for lunch and then onto *Leigh Creek*. This will be our



base for two nights. Our sightseeing flight from here tomorrow over *Lake Eyre South* and the *Marree Man* will be a highlight of our tour.

Day 7 (BLD): Flying over the Outback


Saturday 12 October

Wrights Air - Marree Man, Lake Eyre South & The William Creek Pub

Just to the north of here is Lake Eyre. The sheer magnitude of the *Kati Thanda-Lake Eyre Region* is breathtaking. Our flight crosses over the Dog Fence, the Marree Man, Lake Eyre South to Madigan Gulf, the



mouth of Jackboot, Halligan, and Belt Bay, Silcrete and Dalhunty Islands - landing at William Creek



algae create an amazing kaleidoscope of colour. With water, the reflections are breathtaking. **Wrights Air** who has experienced, professional pilots with extensive



Day 8 (BLD): To Arkaroola

Sunday 13 October



We farewell our hosts at Leigh Creek and make our way into the Gammon Ranges to the east. The *Gammon Ranges*National Park is one of Australia's true tourism gems.

Arkaroola Wilderness Sanctuary is blessed with a unique landscape created over 2 billion years ago and is home to the most rugged chain of mountains in the Australian Outback.

We have lunch on arrival and then a free afternoon. At night there is a chance to visit Australia's largest privately owned *Astronomical Observatory*. Tours of the Universe from this facility and the "star chairs" provide a unique experience for the traveller that is normally only available to scientists and astronomers (entry own cost/depends on local weather conditions).

Day 9 (BLD): Arkaroola Ridge Top Tour

This morning, we take the incredible *4WD* '*Ridge Top*' *Tour'* driving along mine tracks winding through some of Australia's most rugged mountains. Visit 'Crystal Candy Mountain', Mt Painter, Yudanamutana Gorge and Sillers Lookout with awe inspiring views extending more than 80 kms over Lake Frome. We return to Arkaroola for lunch and then the afternoon is free to enjoy the area. Take a self-guided walk or perhaps just kick back and relax.

Monday 14 October

Day 10 (BLD): South through the Flinders

Tuesday 15 October



We have an early breakfast this morning before our travel day ahead. We travel into the Southern Flinders Ranges, spending some time around *Wilpena Pound* including a stop at *Brachina Gorge* and the *Flinders Ranges Visitors Centre*. There will also be time for an optional 30-minute flight over Wilpena Pound with Wrights Air. After a

great day of sightseeing, we continue south for our overnight stop in **Port Pirie**. (Meal inclusions: Breakfast & dinner at the motel / packed lunch).

Day 11 (BLD): Burra & The Mid North

We travel through *Crystal Brook* this morning and then onto *Burra*. It was here in Burra, in 1845, that copper was discovered. Very quickly a town developed with a community of 5000 in 1851 (Adelaide's population was 18 000 at that time). Today the whole town is on the State Heritage Register preserving its great historical value and mining heritage. A local guide will join the coach to

provide us with an introduction to the town's mining history. Copper from Burra's "Monster



Mine" saved South Australia from bankruptcy in the 1840's. It was the largest metal mine in the country employing 1000 people. Cornish and Welsh miners flocked to Burra to work for the South Australian Mining Association, and some set up homes in dugouts hewn out of the banks of the Burra Creek. Small villages which now form Burra North were established - Aberdeen (Scottish), Redruth (Cornish), Llwchyr (Welsh) and Hampton (English). From here we travel

into the *Barossa Valley*. We have planned a visit to the *Barossa Chateau* – a stunning building that sits in one of Australia's most important rose gardens of international significance. Combined with Lyndoch Hill, the overall estate covers an impressive 25 acres, 30,000 roses and 5kms of walkways. The Chateau is also home to one of the largest collections of porcelain in Australia. We enjoy a tour and afternoon tea before heading into *Adelaide* for our final night on tour.
