

#### Day 4 (BLD): TOWNSVILLE TO CAIRNS


#### Tuesday 29 July 2025

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#### Day 7 (BLD): CAIRNS TO ATHERTON TABLELANDS

#### Friday 1 August 2025



This morning, we make our way through the region known as the **Atherton** Tablelands. The region is a rather unique place in Australia and what makes it so special is the combination of its geographic location in the Tropics (between 400 and 1100 metres), its pleasant climate and the volcanic activities which have shaped large parts of its landscape. One of the most dramatic examples of this is Lake Barrine - a beautiful volcanic crater lake. It's here we enjoy a

relaxing cruise on the lake before lunch in the Lake Tearooms. Next, we visit the remarkable Curtain Fig Tree, with its curtain of aerial roots that drop 15 metres to the ground. Large basalt boulders cover the forest floor which is probably why the forest here wasn't cleared for farming – and why the tree remains

standing. Continuing to Gallo Dairyland, we hear about the cheese making process and sample some of the yummy products overlooking the dairy farm. After an interesting day we arrive in Mareeba for our overnight accommodation. Dinner tonight will be at Mareeba Leagues Club. #### Day 8 (BLD): ATHERTON TABLELANDS TO MOUNT SURPRISE

Saturday 2 August 2025 First, we head to Jaques Coffee to discover the world of coffee and how it is grown by joining a coffee tour. We'll watch a coffee documentary, have a look through

the machinery and enjoy a coffee liqueur tasting. Travelling to the small township of Herberton, we step back in time at the delightful Herberton Historic Village. Showcasing Australia's diverse history, this outdoor pioneer museum is a testament to an era that is long gone. We have time to wander the

village which features many priceless antiques as well as buildings that have come from the town's ancestors. This afternoon we travel to Undara National Park, set in the pristine Savannah Woodlands.

On arrival we take a **tour of Kununurra** 

where our sightseeing will include a visit to the town centre and the Diversion Dam, Kellys Knob for excellent views over the surrounding irrigated

land and Ivanhoe Crossing. Our final visit is to the **Mirima National Park**, also called Hidden Valley. Hailed by the locals as the mini–Bungle Bungle range, the

fascinating rock formations have taken shape over millions of years. It's the perfect opportunity to get an "on-ground" experience.

#### DAY 23 (BLD): EXPLORING KUNUNURRA

For those of us who have booked an optional flight over the Purnululu National Park (the Bungle Bungles), we will be collected early morning. For those of us not wanting to fly, this is the perfect opportunity for a sleep-in! After a slightly later breakfast and with the group back together, we visit Argyle Homestead Museum, which offers a fascinating insight into the lives of the early pioneers in the region. Walk through the 1890s former home of the Durack family, who were a prominent farming family. The original homestead sat on Argyle Downs Station but had to be relocated due to the

constructions of Lake Argyle. One of the many highlights will be an **afternoon cruise** that glides among numerous inlets and bays in search of local wildlife including Freshwater Crocodiles. Stay out on the water in an ideal setting to catch the last golden rays of the Kimberley sun – the first of many!

#### **OPTIONAL: Bungle Bungle Scenic Flight**

Embark on an incredible early morning scenic flight over Purnululu National Park to see the Bungle Bungle Range. See a maze of curious orange and black striped beehive shaped domes from above making it the Kimberley's best scenic views.

#### DAY 24 (BLD): EL QUESTRO

The Kimberley is one highlight after another and today is no exception. Today's real destination is **El Questro Station** – a million-acre cattle station and wilderness park. On arrival we enjoy an early lunch before a cruise through Chamberlain Gorge, a waterhole with towering cliffs and lively and interesting bird life. From the Five Rivers Lookout on top of the Bastion Range, we can see where five mighty Kimberley rivers meet and flow into the ocean. We then head to Wyndham, Western Australia's most


northerly town. We visit the port area which still services the mining, pastoral, sugar and tourism industries. After an interesting day we head back to Kununurra. Breakfast and dinner in motel | Lunch at El Questro Station | The Kimberley Grande Resort, Kununurra (PH: 1300 955 549)

#### DAY 25 (BLD): KUNUNURRA TO HALLS CREEK

This morning, we visit The Hoochery Distillery known as Western Australia's oldest continually operation legal Still. Discover the secrets behind how the rum is made, hear stories collected over the years, and enjoy a slice of their famous Ord River Rum Cake. After an interesting morning, we travel to Halls Creek, on the edge of the Great Sandy Desert. The town is full of stories and relics as it was the site of Western Australia's first gold rush. One of the more famous stories is of Russian Jack, a man who carried his injured mate in a wheelbarrow

for over 300 kilometres to get medical attention. A statue is dedicated to his amazing feat here in town. Just outside of Halls Creek is the China Wall. The amazing white stone formations rise high out of the ground and then disappear back into the earth again, making it look like a miniature Great Wall of China. #### DAY 26 (BLD): HALLS CREEK TO FITZROY CROSSING

#### DAY 29 (BLD): EXPLORING BROOME




